

KEYNOTE SPEAKER

Hazrul Affendi Bin Mohmad Razali is a lecturer at Kolej Islam Teknologi Antarabangsa (KITAB) in Pulau Pinang Malaysia with expertise in Teaching and Learning Arabic. His principal study has been in Arabic Studies and Islamic Civilization and in 2017 he completed his Ph.D. from Universiti Kebangsaan Malaysia which looked at the views of Level of Mastery of Grammar Among Teachers of Sijil Tinggi Agama Malaysia (STAM). Throughout his career, he created many works including writing the book such as Introduction to Qiraat Al-Qur'an (2017), The Principles of Proficiency in Reading and Writing Arabic (2013), The Principles of Proficiency in Listening and Speaking Arabic (2013), and The Principle of Fardhu Ain (2012). Another of his works is the writing of several articles, one example of which is an article entitled Elements of Teaching Arabic (2019).



Prof. Bayram COŞTU is a Professor of Science Education at Yildiz Technical University, Istanbul Turkey. He has a wide range of research interests including identification, design, and implementation of intervention strategies to challenge students' conceptions and students' use of analogies and models as an aid to their conceptual understanding of science concepts and history and philosophy of science, nature of science, evaluation of science textbooks and animations to achieve conceptual change. He is the author of more than 30 papers and acts as a reviewer for a range of journals, and is on editorial/advisory/review boards for Journal of Research in Science Teaching, Journal of Chemical Education, Journal, Journal of Turkish Science Education, Eurasian Journal of Educational Research, Chemistry Education: Research and Practice (CERP), Asia-Pacific Forum on Science Learning and Teaching and International Journal of Vocational and Technical Education.



Professor Dato' Dr. Ab. Halim bin Tamuri is currently a lecturer at Selangor International Islamic College, University (KUIS) Malaysia with expertise in Islamic Education, Teacher Training, and Moral Education. His principal study has been in Islamic Education and in 2000 he completed his Ph.D. from the University of Birmingham, UK. Until now, he has created a lot of works such as 103 journal articles, 5 books, and 39 chapters in books. Besides that, he has achieved a lot of achievements or awards such as Dato' Sultan Shafaruddin Idris Shah (D.S.I.S) in Selangor (2010), The Den Rank in Cambodia (2012), Excellent Service Award from Universiti Kebangsaan Malaysia (2004), etc.



Colleen Megowan-Romanowicz, Ph.D. is a senior fellow at American Modeling Teachers Association (AMTA). In 2007 she completed her Ph.D. in Physics Education Research from Arizona State University. She was an assistant professor of science education at Mary Lou Fulton College of Education, Arizona State University until 2011 when she transitioned to a half-time research scientist position to become AMTA's first Executive Officer. In 2014 she retired from ASU to devote her full attention to AMTA. In 2017 she "retired" from the XO position and became AMTA's first Senior Fellow. Colleen continues to write grants, conduct research, teach occasional courses in modeling and cognition, train workshop leaders, and publish on Modeling Instruction. Her current research interests are computational modeling, teacher leadership, out-of-field science teaching, and cognition in Modeling Instruction.
